## Tropical Beach—BCH

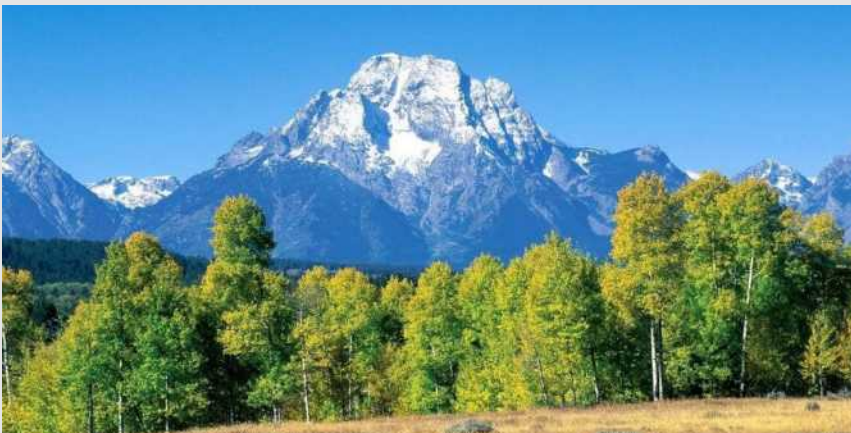
## Lake—LAK

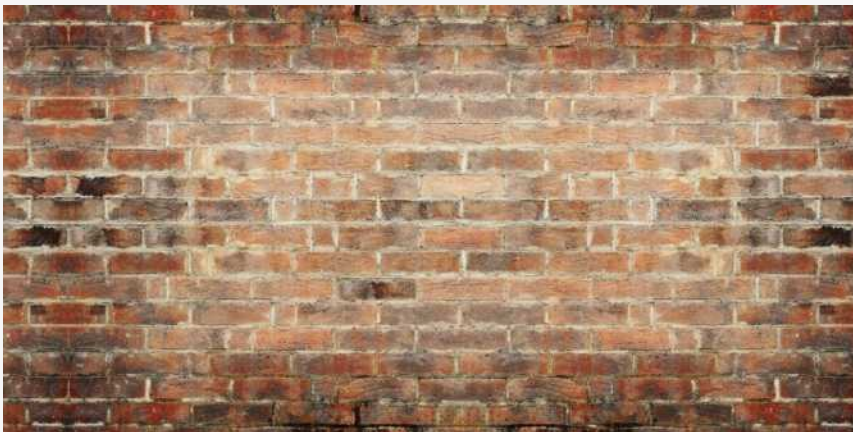
## Path Alternate—PAT

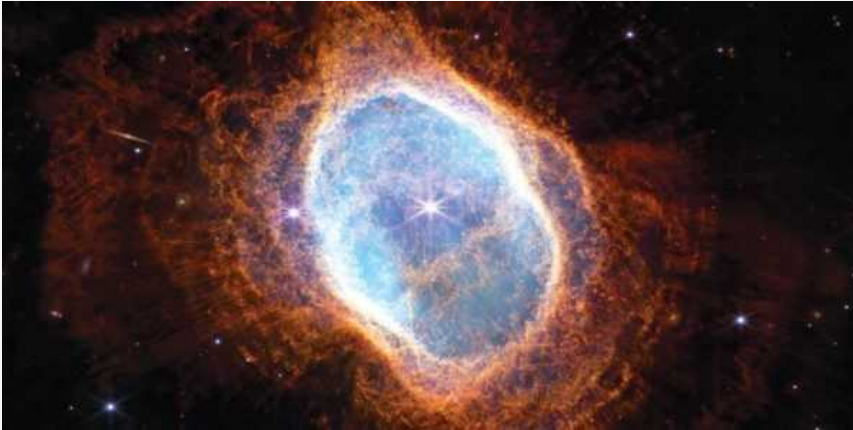
## Stephan's Quintet—SQT

Stephan's Quintet, a striking grouping of 5 separate galaxies took a starring role as The Angels in the 1946 holiday classic, "It's a Wonderful Life." Now these angels can be seen in the highest resolution we know to date, the mosaic of 1000 images containing over 150 million pixels would cover about 1/5th of the moon's diameter.

## Southern Ring Nebula—SRN

Webb's cameras have revealed the secret of this ethereal scene. Hidden by the bright star at the center of this nebula, and cloaked in dust, is a star that has been sending out rings of dust and gas for thousands of years.

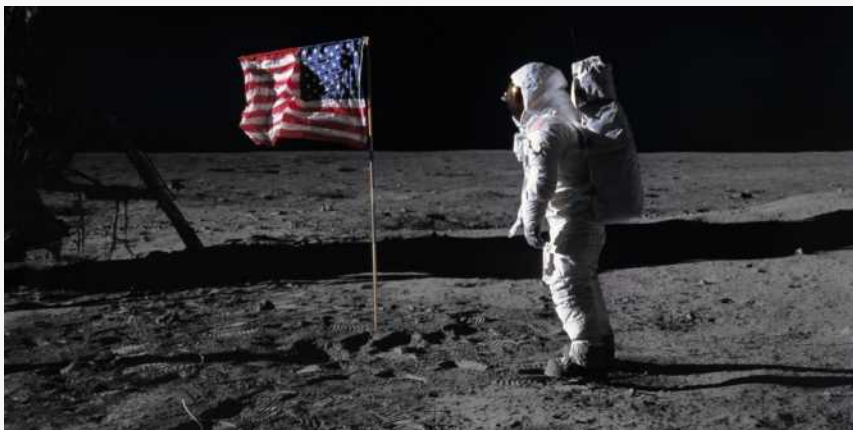
## Asteroid—ARD

It was loaded with infrared film and fitted with a large handle by NASA engineers for the Apollo 11 mission.



## Augusta Golf Course—AGA

One of the most famous golf holes in the world. Augusta's 12th hole is very difficult short par three with varying winds, a narrow green, and strategically placed bunkers and water ponds.

## Congressional Golf Course—CGS

Congressional's 10th hole came under fire in the at the U.S. Open in 1997 with pro golfers calling it tough and the most difficult hole on the course.

## Cypress Point Golf Course—CPP

The 15th hole at Cypress point is a 135 yard par 3 with plenty of bunkers and obstacles, including a shear drop off into the Pacific Ocean. It would be difficult to maintain focus on your game when surrounded by these breathtaking views.

## Edgewood Tahoe Golf Course—ETE

Edgewood is situated at an altitude over 6,200 ft overlooking the majestic Lake Tahoe. The striking 214 yard, par 3, 12th hole never fails to challenge your distance control as aerial shots are key here.

## Harbour Town Golf Course—HTN

Harbour Town's 4th hole was easily one of the most jarring holes of the late 1960s. Pete Dye was enamored with Prestwick in Scotland and utilized the design elements in this course. He did away with gentle, sloping banks into the water, favoring the formidable delineation of railroad ties.

## Silvertip Golf Course—GLF

Silvertip Golf Course in Canmore, Alberta, Canada is often hailed as the most breathtaking mountain courses. It is named for the Silvertip Grizzly Bears that inhabit the region and boasts amazing views of the Three Sisters volcanic peaks.

## Kauai Lagoon Golf Course—KLN

The 16th hole at Kauai Lagoons has been called a diabolical short par-four. The green is situated on a lava formed peninsula and requires accuracy to play. Shoot right and you will find yourself on a steep hillside. Shoot left and you will end up in the Pacific Ocean.

## Laurel Valley Golf Course—LVY

Laurel Valley is a lovely, unassuming course that was one of Arnold Palmer's home courses. Today it hosts corporate events as well as golfers looking to escape the business of the week and relax on well designed and quiet course.

## Monterey Peninsula Golf Course—MPA

The 4th hole at Monterey Peninsula is the first of 13 coastal holes before you head back into a parklands style course. Be careful of the wind when planning your shot as they can go from a nice ocean breeze to strong gales fairly quickly.

## New England Golf Course—NGD

Though known for beautiful fall foliage, New England courses are wonderful year round.

## Pebble Beach Golf Course—PBH

A peaceful sunrise over the 18th hole at Pebble Beach, also known as the most famous finishing hole in golf. When Pebble Beach first opened this was a challenging par-4 with the ocean to the left, a cypress in the middle of the fairway, and out-of-bounds just slightly right. It is no less challenging in its current state as a par-5.

## Sawgrass Island Golf Course—SGI

Barely 100 yards long and surrounded by water, the 17th hole at TPC Sawgrass is the most photographed hole in golf. A record 93 balls ended up in the water in 2007, with 50 of those being from the first round of the Players Championship.

## Sawgrass Golf Course—SGS

Looking out onto the Island and green of the iconic 17th Hole at TPC Sawgrass. While not known for being the most challenging hole in golf, it is certainly the most photographed and easily recognized by those not familiar with golf.

## St. Andrews Golf Course—STA

The 18th Hole at Old St. Andrews is a 361 yard par-4 designed to challenge even the world's best players. Yet it is also hailed as the great equalizer where pros have suffered heart wrenching losses and amateurs have shot thrilling birdies.

## Trent Jones Golf Course—TJS

Finishing the 11th hole at par is a testament to your skill and knowledge of the game. The only ways to keep your ball out of the water is to land on the green or find yourself in the pot bunker. Swirling winds off Lake Manassas add to the difficulty of this small and picturesque hole.
